

INSTRUCTIONS

This form is for UCB graduate students returning to *complete the same degree program* from which they left. It is not to be used for admission to the Graduate Division. Students returning to campus to pursue a new program must apply through the Graduate Application process.

All applicants must also complete a Statement of Legal Residence (SLR). Failure to do so will significantly delay your readmission application. Submit your SLR with this application to the Graduate Division, 318 Sproul Hall. Please retain the Legal Residence Information sheet for future reference.

If you change your address after submitting this application, you should enter the change at **calcentral.berkeley.edu**. (Note: If you are readmitting after a long absence (more than one year), Cal Central might not be available to you until several days after this application is submitted; please keep checking the system periodically.)

If you want to change your field of study, the Graduate Petition for Change of Major or Degree Goal will also be required. This form can be obtained at the Office of the Registrar or at the Graduate Division.

If your application is received and approved in sufficient time, your enrollment appointments will be generated and made available via Cal Central. If you submit this application after instruction has begun for the semester in which you seek readmission, you may not be able to enroll via Cal Central, and you may also need to submit a Petition for Late Enrollment/Registration to enroll in classes.

Please note that readmission for students on withdrawal status (for any reason) is subject to departmental approval and is not guaranteed.
